







# Seminar on the Role of Small and Medium Cities: Drivers of Sustainable Development and Urban-Rural Cooperation

November 15 and 16, 2023 in Cuenca, Spain

## Context

This Seminar is organized in cooperation with the Spanish Presidency of the EU Council in the framework of the ESPON 2030 Cooperation Programme, which aims to support policy development for promoting territorial cohesion and harmonious development of the European territory.

Cohesion remains central to European Union policies, and though employment has been growing and has fully recovered from the crisis reaching its highest value in 2019, regional disparities remain larger than before 2008, as the 8th Cohesion Report reveals. While Cohesion policy was a powerful tool to respond to COVID 19 crisis by mobilizing additional funding, it should now return to its core mission of reducing regional disparities and promoting long term regional development.

To achieve that goal, investments in public services, infrastructure, skills and multi-level governance have continued to drive convergence in recent years, nevertheless, some of these drivers remain concentrated in urban areas. This highlights the need to design an appropriate region-specific investment mix, where small and medium-sized cities are differentiated from large agglomerations.

The importance of innovation is also a a key determinant of long-term regional economic growth, however, some countries, are clearly below the capital region and national average and lack a clear smart specialization strategy and regional innovation ecosystems failing to capture local talent and making them vulnerable and unprepared to new opportunities.

To achieve these goals, there are two milestones of special relevance, these are the implementation of the Territorial Agenda 2030 and the promotion of a polycentric territorial system based on intermediary cities, social inclusion, access to public and private services, the promotion of the role of women and the dignity of work.









As we can see, the new challenges of urban-rural relations show how small and medium-sized cities can act as a balancing factor between population and territories imbalances through the construction of a New Territorial Contract within the framework of common objectives to achieve active, inclusive and functional territories, and ensuring that urban-rural cooperation and the aspirations of the 2030 Agenda of the Sustainable Development Goals are also realized.

In this intricate context, the ESPON seminar brings together some of the most prominent organizations and researchers that are working on in Europe. Through different presentations and plenary sessions participants will get an update on the latest ESPON evidence and research related to how strengthening urban-rural links and the role of small and medium-sized towns and cities could boost economic development and improve quality of life in urban and rural areas. Hence, during the Seminar, we will have an opportunity to:

- Debate on the implementation of the "do not harm to EU cohesion" (DNHC) principle, to raise awareness of demographic challenges and growing urban-rural imbalances.
- Find an space where to exchange and promote networks creation around key policy issues for innovation, economic transition and tech transformation.
- Discuss the needs of the territories to ensure every citizen is given an opportunity and has access to public services..
- Reflect on the role of small and medium-sized cities as intermediaries to build public policies to fight against depopulation and bring socio-territorial cohesion.











Identify challenges and opportunities within the framework of multilevel and multi-stakeholder governance.



Foster sustainable growth and competitiveness while considering the importance of young and old people and their role as city change makers.



Define conclusions on how small and medium-sized cities will contribute to build a New Territorial Contract to achieve active, inclusive and functional territories.

Inputs and evidence from ESPON territorial findings will fuel debates and discussions, addressing the key issues surrounding current and future public policy formulation processes.

In a nutshell, the aim is to provide insights and understanding on the new challenges to territorial cohesion, revealing how, by working together, Europe can recover through crises, and emerge stronger. ESPON territorial evidence will feed the debates and discussions, addressing the key topics surrounding the current and future policymaking processes.
