The Insider Access programme is aimed at helping to empower prisoners to challenge 'Learned Helplessness' and start planning a new positive future.



The GIEL project in England has been delivered by Insider Access in communities across the Thames Valley, East of England, in HMP The Mount Prison, Milton Keynes Probation and with Penrose Roots in Luton.

In addition to training around saving water and energy, sustainable mobility and responsible consumption, participants received an eco savings kit, containing tools for reduction of their eco footprint.

Rising household bills, together with fuel poverty are key issues in England, and the GIEL project looks to pilot innovative approaches that can be mainstreamed by other organisations across the UK.

Raising awareness of sustainability issues and to engage non traditional learners into understanding their impact on the environment and how to reduce their ecological foot print whilst developing employability.
